#### WELL, WE WANTED TO BE A SPORT!

According to a number of news reports, Geir Helgemo, one of the world's top bridge players, was suspended by the World Bridge Federation after a drug test found the presence of two banned substances. There is no suggestion that these were enhancing his play but they are banned for all sportspeople.

The New York Times reported on March 2, 2019.

The World Bridge Federation suspended Mr. Helgemo after a random test found the presence of synthetic testosterone and Clomifene, a medication typically used to treat infertility in women that can also increase testosterone levels in men.

Mr. Helgemo, a professional player who represents Monaco at tournaments, will not be allowed to participate in a bridge competition until November, the Federation said.

Mr. Helgemo asked for the lab to recheck his results after they came back from a test taken at a championship competition in Orlando, Florida, in September. They came back unchanged.

Eventually, he settled on the most likely explanation: Mr. Helgemo told the federation that he had been trying to control his weight and had been taking supplements — with unknown ingredients — given to him by a friend who was a body builder.

Mr. Helgemo, who is serving a prison sentence in Norway for tax fraud unrelated to his suspension, could not be reached on Saturday.

What an interesting life some bridge players seem to have!

#### **ONGOING BRIDGE EDUCATION**

A subcommittee meeting was held last month to discuss bridge teaching strategies. The group consisted of Clive Bunnett, Del Ward, Gloria McDonald, Di McAlister, and Geoff Allen. This is a summary of the discussions.

- Beginners' and Improvers' lessons are quite well catered for with Clive doing the 6 (often 8 with consolidation) week introductory lessons and then Fay doing the improvers
- Fay also helps Del do the supervised play on a Tuesday morning and they will use some weeks to offer more structured revision of the improver's topics
- There are now many sets of hands in the dealing machine for topics but some gaps still (penalty doubles, unusual 2NT, Michaels' cue bids and all the advanced topics)
- Elsie continues to run sessions on Saturday mornings for improvers
- The big hiatus in lessons is from improvers to intermediate and advanced and several options for these lessons were discussed:
  - ➤ Short discussion of hand(s) after play, mainly on Mondays Di has done a pilot of this which had about 10 people and went well
  - ➤ Short talks on Monday
  - ➤ Talks/ lessons on Saturday morning (or Tuesday?)
  - ➤ Geoff has prepared a power point talk on the unassuming cue bid which looks like a good vehicle for teaching
  - ➤ Gloria suggested having a calendar of future talks, but the group decided to start first with 2 talks Di on RCKB this Saturday 30/03 and Geoff on Jakoby 2NT on Saturday 13/04 and then assess the level of interest
  - ➤ There is quite a long list of potential topics which could be taught
  - ➤ There is a shortage of people willing to commit to regular teaching at this level

The work has already started. Di made a presentation with practice hands of the Roman Key Card convention on Saturday morning 30 March which was attended by at least 24 people and was very well received. There will be presentations in the future on various conventions by those with an interest in doing so.

Our education process is gradually developing but it needs more personnel to conduct the sessions.

Comments on this and suggestions for topics of interest are welcome.
