### **WEAK 2 (OR NOT)**

**\*\*\***

During one of my stints living and playing in Brisbane, my partner and I travelled to Toowoomba to play in their Congress. One memory seared into my brain was of Ivy Dahler (who had played for the Queensland and Australian women's team on numerous occasions in the 70's) tearing into her partner (Enid Busch, who also subsequently played for Queensland if not Australia) because she'd opened a weak 2 of a Major with 3 cards in the other major. Ivy was upset because they didn't find their (other) Major fit. These days no one worries about such niceties. What rules do you apply to your Weak 2's? For instance: will you open a Weak 2 (or any pre-empt) with a void. Will it always be a six-card suit or may it have 7 cards? You really need partnership agreement on this. Here's an example from a hand I played in December.

As Dealer, West opened 2 Spades. East holding a void in Spades and 6 Clubs (KQJ875) hesitated for some time then reluctantly passed. We didn't rescue them from this awful contract so we ended up with 100% on the board. East/West are an established partnership, yet East couldn't trust that their partner would have 1 or more Clubs. Surely a 6-1 fit at the 3-level is better than a 6-0 fit at the 2 level? As it was 3C could have made 10 tricks.

As an aside, what would you open with: S: K 10 8 5 4 2 H: K 5 D: 7 C: A 10 6 3? (Yes, it's West's hand.)

Everybody seems to open light these days. The hand has 10 points and 10 cards in the 2 longer suits so it satisfies the "rule of 20" (or is that now 19?), **and** it has a safe minimum re-bid. I would open the hand 1S with the intention of bidding 2C over 1NT from partner, or 2S over a red suit at the 2 level. The bidding might go: 1S / 1NT / 2C / 2D / 2S, or perhaps: 1S / 2D / 2S / 2 or 3NT. I always show the 4-card suit before repeating the 6-card suit if points allow. I would NOT bid 3C over 2D as this would promise 15+ HCP. As the hands lay, the bidding would have gone: 1S / 2C / 3C / Pass. 2NT made 8 tricks, but 3C made 10 for a better Pairs Score.


