FORCING OR NOT

I've always thought that if I change suit in response to my partner's overcall, my bid was forcing to suit agreement (or the lowest level of NT available). I often bid a Major after my partner has overcalled a Minor when I have a fit with that minor because I'm looking for a better score. I will never bid a weak hand because I didn't like my partner's suit in an uncontested auction. If their overcall is so poor, they need rescuing, they shouldn't have made it! I had my belief confirmed when I finally got around to reading the October issue of the ABF magazine. I usually enjoy reading "A game at the club with Barbara Travis" (yes, another lady who has played for Australia) but one hand she discussed really affirmed my thinking.

The bidding so far has been: 1D / 2C / Pass / (?). What would you bid with: S: J 8 H: K 10 8 7 6 D: K 9 6 C: A Q 3 ? At the time, Barbara made what she called the "practical bid" of 3NT. After all, without 2 of the top 3 Clubs, partner either has 6 Clubs (a "good suit"?) or a "good hand" with outside values (and surely a stopper in Spades?). Bidding 3NT protects the Diamond suit from an opening Diamond lead. Barbara actually says: 'I should have responded with a forcing 2H'. This would have resulted in a safer 4H contract. Note, she describes 2H as forcing! 3NT was the wrong bid.

Back to the overcall. What would you bid with S: A 9 2 H: A 4 3 2 D: 2 C: K J 8 5 2 after your Right Hand Opponent opens the bidding with 1D? You are short in Diamonds and have 4/3 in the Majors.

Did you make another 'wrong' bid and overcall 2C? To quote Barbara: 'The suit lacks quality for a 2-level overcall (though it is fine for a one-level overcall). The hand is ideal for a takeout double instead."

Teaching ideas are developed through discussion and practical demonstrations.

ANSWER TO INTERESTING HAND - QUESTION

Draw 4 rounds of trumps, play out your hearts tricks, then the Ace clubs followed by the Queen. The opponents now need to either open up the diamonds for a free finesse or give you a ruff and sluff for the 12th trick.
